Apr 3rd: "Tribal Leadership" -- DeAnna Mooney & Nancy Cliff. DeAnna & Nancy will present a TED Talk DVD on "Tribal Leadership" by David Logan. This talk along with a brief introduction to Covenanting Among UUs is the beginning of conversations planned for the coming year.
