Welcoming Days of Observance from Dave Becker - April 12th is GLSEN's Day of (No) Silence. GLSEN (pronounced "glisten") is an educational non-profit formerly known as the Gay, Lesbian & Straight Education Network. GLSEN's Day of NO Silence is a nationally-recognized student-led demonstration where LGBTQ+ students and allies all around the country—and the world—protest the harmful effects of harassment & discrimination of LGBTQ+ people in schools. In previous years, students would go through the school day without speaking, ending the day with Breaking the Silence rallies and events; sharing their experiences during the protest; bringing attention to ways their schools and communities can become more inclusive. Now, with more than 800 anti-LGBTQ+ bills introduced last year, this year's Day of (No) Silence will be a day of active protest. Started in the mid-1990s by two college students, the Day of (No) Silence now reaches hundreds of thousands of students each year, serving as an organizing tool to end the silencing effect of anti-LGBTQ bias. April 22–28 is Lesbian Visibility Week. Celebrated annually on April 26 from its start in 2008 through 2019, and expanded to Lesbian Visibility Week in 2020, this week is an opportunity to recognize & celebrate the incredible contributions & vibrancy of the lesbian community within the larger LGBTQIA+ community. It serves as a way of acknowledging erasure of lesbian spaces & the need to preserve & celebrate lesbian culture, distinct as it is from other gay, bi, trans, & queer experiences. Lesbian Visibility Day/Week highlights lesbian figures in sports, entertainment, & history, & creates a level of awareness for a segment of the LGBTQIA+ community that does not really get a lot of attention and which is not monolithic or homogenous, recognizing that each facet of the lesbian community comes with its own sense of struggle and issues.
