Note from the Board Chair Carlos Price -- On July 4 we celebrate our national Independence Day. As Americans we value independence and self-reliance. Our national elections are often decided not by Democrats or Republicans, but by political Independents. We sometimes describe Fellowship as a group of religious independents. Independence implies freedom to act on our own without constraint. But is independence overrated? Strong families, strong fellowships, and strong communities require relationships marked by interdependence. We rely on others and allow them to rely on us. Maybe interdependence is more important than independence.

July Welcoming Days of Observance – July 14 is International Non-Binary People's Day. This day celebrates and raises awareness of non-binary people—who do not exclusively identify as a man or a woman, or who may identify as both a man and a woman, or may identify outside of these categories altogether. Australia, Bangladesh, Canada, Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands, New Zealand, and—as of April 2022—the United States, include non-binary options in their passports. In 22 U.S. states—including New Mexico—a resident may select "X" to mark their gender on driver licenses, and 27 states—also including New Mexico—will issue a new birth certificate and not require sex reassignment surgery nor court order in order to change the gender marker. This date has been celebrated since 2012 and was chosen as it falls precisely midway between International Women's Day on 8 March and International Men's Day on 19 November. July 4 is Independence Day. This commemorates the day in 1776 that the Second Continental Congress unanimously adopted the Declaration of Independence. This set down what Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. declared, on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in August 1963, to be a "promissory note to which every American was to fall heir"—that "all [persons] are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness."

July 26 is Disability Independence Day. This day celebrates the anniversary of the 1990 signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act. The landmark legislation has served as a de facto bill of rights for Americans with disabilities by assuring them access to economic and civic opportunities. Its passage represented an unprecedented bipartisan effort to acknowledge the centuries of discrimination suffered by the disability community, and a fundamental change to how they live their lives.
