News from the Board by Board Secretary Nancy Stephens – At the 4/19/24 Board meeting the Treasurer’s Report showed income greater than expenses. Upcoming Give Grandly donations to Social Justice will be matched by a generous donor. UUFSC has a new insurance policy with State Farm. The new policy lists covered inventory at \$11,000. UFSC's practice is always to have at least two adults in the family program area with a sign in sheet each Sunday. The board approved the 2024-2025 budget and draft agenda for the Semi Annual Meeting (SAM) May 19, 2024. Printed copies of the budget available at the SAM. Membership is up, but the total pledge amount is down. Funds are available for 1-2 attendees (virtually) UU GAC in June.

Note from the Board Chair – One of the shared UU Values proposed for the UUA’s article II revision is generosity, defined as: “We cultivate a spirit of gratitude and hope. We covenant to freely and compassionately share our faith, presence, and resources. Our generosity connects us to one another in relationships of interdependence and mutuality.” We have many volunteers who generously give their time & talents. Consider Give Grandly on 5/4 - an annual event in our community that allows an opportunity to give to multiple non-profits that may never get as much publicity as more established charities.

Welcoming Days of Observance from Dave Becker - May is Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month (<https://fapac.org/AAPI-Resources>) **and Jewish American Heritage Month** (<https://jewishamericanheritage.org/>). ****May 17 is International Day against Homophobia, Transphobia, & Biphobia.** First conceived in 2004, this aims to raise awareness of violence, discrimination, and repression of LGBTQIA+ persons & communities around the world, to celebrate sexual a& gender diversities, and to promote interest in work on behalf of the rights of LGBTQIA+ persons worldwide. The date was chosen to commemorate the 1990 decision by the World Health Organization to remove homosexuality from the International Classification of Diseases. May 17 is particularly strong in Europe & Latin America, where it is commemorated with marches, parades, festivals, arts & culture events. This day is widely regarded as an initiative that is working to advance the rights of people with diverse sexual orientations, gender identities or expressions, & sex characteristics. In 2021, U.S. president Joe Biden used May 17 to highlight efforts to alleviate LGBTQIA+ discrimination and to call on Congress to pass the Equality Act.
