Welcoming Days of Observance -- August 9 is International Day of the World's Indigenous People. About 476 million indigenous peoples live in the world, across 90 countries. Less than 6% of the world's population, they account for 15% of the poorest. They speak a vast majority of the world's estimated 7,000 languages & represent 5,000 different cultures. Indigenous peoples are inheritors & practitioners of unique cultures & ways of relating to people & the environment. They have retained social, cultural, economic & political characteristics that are distinct from those of the dominant societies in which they live. They have cultural differences, yet share common problems related to the protection of their rights as distinct peoples. Throughout history, their rights have been violated. Indigenous peoples today, are among the most disadvantaged & vulnerable groups of people in the world. The international community now recognizes that special measures are required to protect their rights & maintain their distinct cultures & way of life. To raise awareness of the needs of these population groups, Aug 9th is the International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples, chosen in recognition of the first meeting of the UN Working Group on Indigenous Populations in Geneva in 1982 https://www.un.org/en/observances/indigenous-day ***August 26 is Women's Equality Day. This day celebrates the anniversary of the 1920 certification of the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Consitution granting women the right to vote. Congress & the President traditionally have proclaimed Women's Equality Day every year since 1973.
